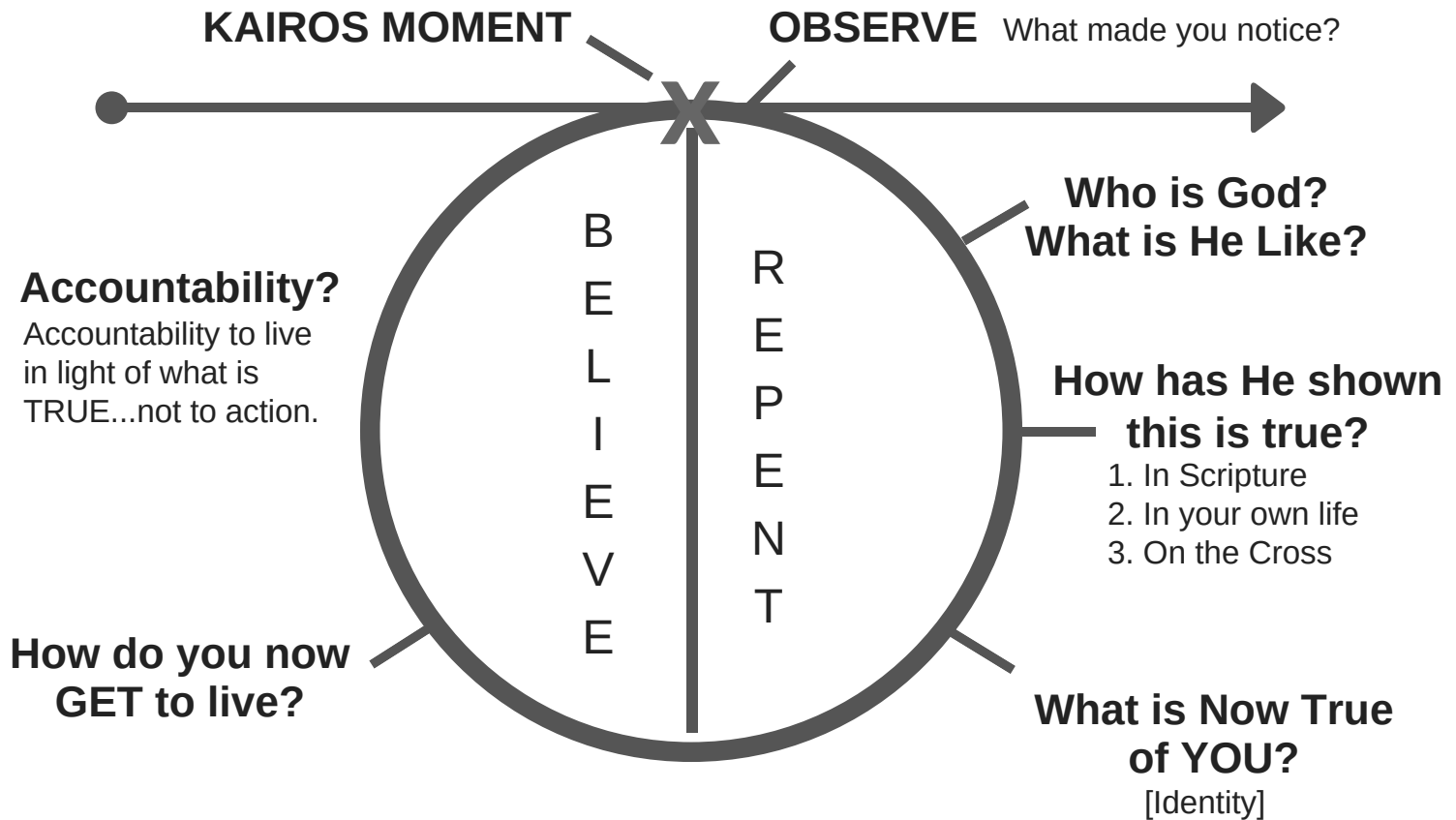


The Circle



NOTE: Kairos: The word kairos is used over 90 different times in the New Testament and having varying shades of meaning. The Greeks had two words for time. Chronos, where we get chronology from. This meant linear time – the days, weeks, months and years. And then there were the kairos moments, divine moments. Kairos moments are those moments of epiphany, small or large that cause us to make decisions that shape our destiny. Kairos moments may be monumental, or they may be mundane, for God even speaks through a whisper. They may be moments of great joy, or they may be moments of great sorrow. Seeing your kairos moments in one thing, responding to them is yet another. We respond to them by asking ourselves, what is God saying to me in the moment, and how does he want me to respond? The ability to see and respond to our kairos moments in life is one of the paths to maturity. So what has been your kairos moment recently and how have you responded to it?

Repentance is not “feeling bad” about your choices or actions; it is turning from a pattern of unbelief and turning to belief in what is true of God and now true of you. Then we can act out of our new, restored beliefs!
